### Ushpizin

Our Sisterhood and Men's Club are sponsoring a delightful movie called *Ushpizin* on October 10. If you haven't seen it you should come. The strange title of this movie and of this article is based on a wonderful Jewish custom – of inviting exalted guests, imaginary guests into the Sukkah each of the nights of Sukkot. *Ushpizin* is Aramaic for guests.

The exalted guests that Judaism wants us to invite are Abraham and Sarah; Isaac and Rebekka, Jacob, Rachel and Leah – and so on.

I once did an exercise with my High School students – I asked them who would they invite into their Sukkah if they could invite anyone! There was not an Abraham or Sarah to be found in their responses. As you might imagine there were a lot of movie and rock stars – a lot of “famous” people. We live in a world where Justin Beiber is in more demand than *Avraham Avinu*.

Funny you should mention Justin Beiber.

Some of you commented to me recently that you saw my son Ari on TV. Ari is the Associate Rabbi of Temple Beth Am in Los Angeles and was invited to join a minister, and an imam to stand with Justin Beiber on the recent coast to coast live telethon that sought to raise money for disaster relief in the wake of Hurricanes Harvey and Irma. Ari felt that: “By simply standing alongside a pastor and an imam, I was attempting to make a silent statement of interfaith solidarity in the wake of tragedy. Natural disasters require human responses and I was there to play a very small part in trying to help those affected.”

Picture my little *boychick* in the green room with the likes of Oprah, George Clooney, Steven Colbert and on and on. In addition to doing a lot of good, I am sure it was a lot of fun. Ari wrote an article for the LA Jewish Journal after this experience and suggested that as exciting as it was to meet all these mega-stars the person who impressed him the most was a name none of us will probably recognize.

Ari wrote: “While all of the superstars who made the effort to participate in the telethon deserve praise, the superstar who I want to tell you about is someone who you wouldn't have seen on the TV screen. Her name is Sheryl. She's a middle-aged woman who has been a production coordinator for decades in Hollywood. She often works behind the scenes helping to make sure massive productions, like

the Oscars or blockbuster movies, run smoothly. She is kind and humble. She met me at the entrance, got me “credentialed,” and escorted me into the green room where the other superstars were gathering. Sheryl told me that she had volunteered her time that day (as everyone involved in the production had). She said that she saw the devastation in Houston and wondered how she could utilize her professional talents to help in some way. Sheryl

is a superstar because she reminded me that each of us can do something to respond when disaster strikes.”

And then Ari concluded: “Not all of us are famous, but each of us has a role to play. Without Sheryl, the shining faces of Justin Timberlake and Julia Roberts (okay, enough name-dropping) wouldn't have been broadcast to millions of people across the country offering hope and a way to help. Thank God for Sheryl and the many others who volunteer, are kind, take pride in their work, and make a difference – every day.”

So now, who are you going to invite to your Sukkah? Justin Beiber or Sheryl? My advice is to go with Sheryl. Not only is she more likely to accept – but I suspect you will have a more rewarding experience. And just in case Sheryl can't make it either...I suspect you will not have a hard time thinking of others just like her.

### On The Other Side of Shiva

Dear Friends,

If I had to count the times I visited your homes during your observances of Shiva, it would probably number in the hundreds and I was there to comfort you and your family and to lead your Shiva minyans.

Now it was our turn. My wife Marsha lost her mom Lucille z"l a month ago and there we were part of the same age-old ritual but now, we were on the other side. Now you were there to comfort us, to lead our minyans, to feed and nourish us physically and spiritually and to pick us up in our time of despair.

I remember as I was growing up my father repeatedly gave me the same sage advice: Never judge anyone until you are in their shoes. I believe this can apply here too. It is hard to know the pain, the sorrow, the void death leaves behind until you experience it yourself and it isn't until then that you truly appreciate the value of the people who step into your life for that critical week and offer to do whatever it takes to ease your pain and take care of EVERYTHING for you so you can just mourn. We are truly grateful for all of your support and love.

A little about Marsha's mom Lucille z"l, may her memory be a blessing. She was a sweet, optimistic lady with a fighting spirit to the end who hailed from a small town in Indiana, a member of the only two Jewish families in town. Her parents made sure that she and her three sisters had opportunities to find Jewish husbands by sending them to bigger towns – Chicago, Indianapolis, New York. This is how Lucille ended up here. During her long and wonderful marriage to David z"l, she was primarily a mother to Marsha and her brother Bruce and a homemaker but on the side she became a successful typesetter, working from home to service the printing industry. She was a doting grandmother to her four loving grandchildren and after a long life of 92 years she died peacefully and without pain. For more than 10 years Marsha was her caretaker as she was for her father David and no one could ask for a better

and more devoted daughter than David and Lucille had. They were lucky to have her care for them and Marsha was lucky to have them in her life for so many years. This very close bond makes for an even bigger void now and therefore your support during the Shiva and beyond is felt and appreciated so much more.

### What the World Needs Now Is Kindness

Now is Love Sweet Love.” After Dionne Warwick initially rejected the idea of recording it, Jackie DeShannon recorded the song followed by Dionne Warwick and The Supremes in 1968. “What the World Needs Now” reached number #7 on the pop charts in America and #1 in Canada. I have been thinking that for this High Holy Day period of reflection, self-assessment and repentance, that what we need the most in the world, is ‘kindness, sweet kindness.’

The late historian, Will Durant, who with his wife Ariel, wrote the eleven-volume biography of mankind, *The Story of Civilization*, was interviewed on his 94<sup>th</sup> birthday and was asked what lesson he had learned from a lifetime of reading and writing. He responded, ‘if you insist on one brief answer, I say kindness and that is the finest, most successful method of behavior of any individual to the individuals they meet.’

My teacher, the late Rabbi Sidney Greenberg, wrote an essay almost fifty years ago entitled, “Make Warm Fuzzies Today.” Rabbi Greenberg asked a young student, ‘what did you do in school today?’ ‘We made warm fuzzies.’ ‘What are warm fuzzies?’ ‘Well, warm fuzzies are things you say to make people feel good.’ The young student’s teacher had taught her and her classmates a valuable lesson. Rabbi Greenberg suggested, “The person who has not learned kindness remains uneducated no matter how many diplomas adorn his wall or how many degrees that follow her signature. The person who has learned to be kind has mastered the most vital subject in life’s curriculum. A person may not have the opportunity for much formal schooling or their familiarity with books not very intimate. But if a person has learned to bring a ray of light, where there is darkness, a touch of softness where life has been hard, a word of cheer to life drooping spirits – that person is best equipped to live life as it should be lived.”

Many years ago, syndicated columnist Art Buchwald wrote an essay that was later included in ‘Chicken Soup for the Soul.’ The column was entitled, “Love and the Cabbie.”

Buchwald wrote about how he would always be nice to his cab drivers. His friend, in the cab with him, thought Buchwald a fool. Buchwald responded: “I believe that I made that taxi driver’s day. Suppose he has twenty fares that day. He is going to be nice to those twenty people because I was nice to him. They, in turn, will be kinder to their employees and shopkeepers. Eventually, the good will spread to 1,000 people! Now that isn’t bad, is it?”

So learning from Art Buchwald, here is what I try to do every day. When I am in a cab, I ask the driver how he is doing today. When I am at Ben’s Deli I always say hi to the people who bring me coleslaw and pickles, clear my dishes and make my sandwiches. When the conductor on the LIRR takes my ticket, I always say hi. When I am on the street in Manhattan and I see people who look lost, I ask if I can help.

In his inaugural address, President George W. Bush urged our nation to be a kinder and gentler nation. I found a website in preparing this essay that focuses on being ‘fluent

in kindness.’ The website urges its readers ‘to practice kindness to others, to ourselves and to our planet and to make a positive difference in our world.’

So as we continue and conclude our Fall holy day season, I would like to suggest a slight recommendation to Hal David and Burt Bacharach’s song:

“What the world needs now is kindness, sweet kindness, No not just for some, but for everyone.”

As we sit in our Sukkot and in our sacred sanctuary, as we join with our family and friends for festive meals and reflection on our rabbis’ sermons and messages, let us vow to revive the spirit of kindness so needed in our lives, our communities and our nation.

**T**he Herbert Tarr North Shore Institute for Adult Jewish Education will begin **Monday, October 30, 2017 at 7:30 pm** with **Ambassador Dan Shapiro** as the keynote speaker.

Drawing on his eight years serving in the Obama Administration and his current vantage point from Israel on the Trump Administration, Ambassador Shapiro will review highs and lows, bust some myths and give a behind-the-scenes account of Israeli-Palestinian talks, the fight over the Iran deal and the many successes in U.S.-Israel relations. He will analyze prospects for future bilateral cooperation, regional peace and security initiatives and some continued dissonance between these two close allies in the next four years.

As Israel marks 50 years since the Six Day War, Ambassador Shapiro will analyze how the implications of that victory continue to resonate in present-day Israel and will play a key role in shaping Israel's future and the future of the U.S.-Israel relationship.

## RELIGIOUS SCHOOL

As we celebrated **Rosh Hashana & Yom Kippur**, our Vav students had a meaningful experience of creating their very own shofar. In addition to learning how to make and blow the shofar, the students learned the deep symbolism of the shofar as well as the three T's: **Teshuvah (repentance), Tefillah (prayer) and Tzedakah (charity)**.

Our Zayin students will have a **Lulav & Etrog** workshop in honor of the **Sukkot** holiday. All of our students will decorate and beautify the **TBS Sukkah**. We will dwell in the sukkah, rejoice and sing songs, have a snack and shake the lulav and etrog. We will partake in our ancient tradition of dwelling in the sukkah and come together as a school community as we fulfill the mitzvah of *Ley shev ba Sukkah* (to dwell in the sukkah).

The **four mitzvot** are observed while visiting the **sukkah**.

- **USHPIZIN:** We welcome guests to the Sukkah.
- **ARBA MINIM:** We hold & shake four species of plants consisting of palm, myrtle, & willow (LULAV) together with citron (ETROG).
- We **shake the lulav & etrog** every day of Sukkot except on Shabbat and recite the blessings over them.
- **EAT IN THE SUKKAH:** We dwell in the Sukkah for seven days. It is a mitzvah to entertain and eat meals in the Sukkah.

On **Thursday October 12th at 5:30 pm**, we will be having a **Holiday-a-Lot** program in honor of **Shemini Atzeret** and **Simchat Torah** for **ECC** and **Kindergarten-Gan** and **First grade-Aleph** students. This interactive service (located in the ECC multi-purpose room) will highlight the meaning of the holiday. The ECC Director, Suzy Freier and I are looking forward to welcoming you and your child to this spirited experience.

On **Saturday, October 14th**, we will be having our first **Shabbat Family Study** program of the season. This year we will be including **Aleph and Bet families** in the family study. We are proud of the level of learning that takes place during these Shabbat family-friendly gatherings. I encourage you and your child to participate. In addition, please join us on various Saturday morning Shabbatot for our interactive **Mishpacha Family Service (for grades 2-7)** led by Joseph

Soffer and at our **Mini Minyan (for ages 3-7)** led by Kim Weinberg and Julie Gittlin.

Our **Israel @70th** kick-off event with IDF Captain Libby Weiss highlighted a special conversation about wounded soldiers and the personal experience and stories of these exceptional IDF soldiers committed to the State of Israel.

Students of Kitah Hay, Vav and Zayin established a connection with these soldiers in a meaningful way.

**We are immersing our students in Israeli culture!** Our **Zayin** students' have begun a year-long **Israel study** with Senior Shaliach, Ariel Magal and the Junior Shaliach, Nimi Bejarano of the Israel Center of the Sid Jacobson JCC. Their focus will encompass different Israeli communities' successes and challenges. Our **Shinshin, Ella**, has been getting to know

### *Solidarity Weekend in Charlottesville, Virginia*

The demonstrations that began in Charlottesville, Virginia on August 12 not only adversely affected a small and vibrant Jewish community, but they also reminded us that within our country, groups such as white supremacists and neo-Nazis still exist. We may never be able to eradicate the hatred displayed by a portion of our society, but that does not mean that we should not confront and challenge evil when it presents itself so openly.

This weekend of, September 8-10, under the sponsorship of *UJA Federation of New York*, a delegation from New York travelled to Charlottesville to offer support to the Jewish community. Notable attendees to this Solidarity Shabbat included Dani Dayan, Consul General of Israel in New York, Eric S. Goldstein, CEO of *UJA Federation of New York*, and Eric Fingerhut, National President of *Hillel*. My husband Marty and I, along with TBS members Cindy and David Feldman, attended this Solidarity Shabbat. It was an enlightening and moving mission. The weekend started with Friday night services at the *Hillel* at the University of Virginia, with approximately 100 students, faculty, and others. After services, we enjoyed a *Unity Shabbat Dinner* attended by approximately 250 people, including participants from the diverse university community. After dinner, a round table discussion was held. Events leading to the demonstrations, personal concerns and feelings, and reasons why we chose to attend the weekend were explored. The emotions and concerns raised about this incident, were both troubling and necessary to investigate. The impact had traumatized many of the students; one tearfully admitted that she took down the *mezuzah* from her door, since the neo-Nazis had vowed to return to the college grounds.

On Shabbat morning, we walked to Congregation Beth Israel, passing *Emancipation Park* (formerly *Robert E. Lee Park*), only two short blocks from where the demonstrations and violence began. A meaningful service was led by lay leaders, including women. We celebrated with kiddish lunch and had the opportunity to engage with members of the congregation.

In the late afternoon, we met Rabbi Shlomo and Channa Meyer from *Chabad House*, and enjoyed a *seudah shelishit* (the customary third meal of Shabbat, eaten in the late

afternoon before sunset) followed by Havdalah. We had a wonderful and lively discussion at the table covering the rabbi's early life in Romania to events of the today. That evening, we met six of fifteen people who were welcomed to stay at the *Chabad House* due to displacement from Hurricane Irma. Rabbi and Mrs. Meyer were open and frank about their phone calls from the mayor of Charlottesville as well as the FBI. They are currently in the process of installing extra security to the residence.

Consul General Dani Dayan made several comments at the conclusion of the service at Congregation Beth Israel. Most notably, he concluded that the events of that fateful weekend were "reminiscent of another continent in another century." Our weekend visit was an affirmation that we will not be bystanders. Our presence was significant, as a first step in the healing process from this hateful assault.

Back at Temple Beth Sholom we, at Sisterhood, are eagerly awaiting Rosh Hashanah, with wishes of a year filled with health, happiness and peace, hoping that our prayers will be answered by the closing of the Book on Yom Kippur.

Our Sukkah Party, in conjunction with Men's Club, will be on October 10, at 7:45. We will be seeing a humorous, yet meaningful film entitled, *Ushpizin* (guests). We will enjoy foods of Israel and have a great time.

Everyone loves our Challah Bake events. On October 19, and inspired by a presentation at WLJC Convention this past July, we will be baking pink challahs, with *Shasheret*. This national organization supports Jewish women and families facing breast and ovarian cancer and will present vital information about genetic testing for the Jewish community. Come braid with us. Our first *Lunch & Learn* will be on Tuesday, October 24 right after our Adult Learning classes. It's wonderful to learn, talk and lunch with friends. The Cantor's class, *Hot off the Press*, will be starting just two days later on October 26 at 8:00. As you can see, Sisterhood has an action packed month planned. Please become a member and be part of it.
